All programs are subject to change. Patrons arriving late are requested to wait until applause breaks or intermissions to be seated, as per performers' contracts.


Cameras & Recording Devices

Jonathan Frey

Growing from research of the grid-a literal symbol of order, Jonathan Frey creates largescale paintings and drawings that explore games, language, and the figure that consider various aspects of cultural and national identity. Frey's work additionally explores definitions of American identity, focusing on the differences between the iconic representations of the United States and the lived experience. The work seeks to uncover myths, clichés, and stereotypes that have become accepted parts of American culture.

Jonathan Frey is Assistant Professor of Art and Art History at Bucknell University, Lewisburg, PA. Frey received a BFA in Visual Communication Design from the University of Dayton, Dayton, OH, an MFA in Studio Art from the University of Florida, Gainsville, FL, and a second MFA in Visual Communication Design from Pratt Institute, New York City, NY.

Hannah Parrett & Britny Wainwright

October 28 - November 20, 2022

Opening Reception & Artist Talks Friday, October 28 6:00 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.

This two-person exhibition explores relationships between ceramics, fiber, and painting. Through the overlap of two artists' languages in repetition and pattern, familiar objects of domestic life are re-assessed in a public space. Painted curtains camouflage and reveal false

interiors, ceramic vessels are framed by textile cushions, where together they create the possibility of a private space. This show uses quilted images and materials to explore different methods of meaning making through the piecing together of fragments. The structure of the quilt is a starting point in both artists' work in identifying its power as an object of memory and an object that can function as a storytelling device.

Hannah Parrett lives and works in Columbus, OH. Parrett received a BA from Maine College of Art & Design, Portland, ME and an MFA from The Ohio State University, Columbus, OH.

Britny Wainwright lives and works in Columbus, OH. Wainwright received a BFA from the School of Art & Design, Alfred University, Alfred, NY and an MFA from The Ohio State University, Columbus, OH.















Sidney Mullis

Through child-like play and experimentation, Sidney Mullis transforms a wide variety of materials into unusual surfaces and forms. As a continuing endeavor, Mullis builds a make-believe forest that is the resurrection space for her childhood self. The invented ceremonial landscape becomes a place where Mullis questions the ability to remember, re-enliven, and retain childlike attributes.

Sidney Mullis lives and works in Pittsburgh, PA. Mullis received a BA in Studio Art from the University of Mary Washington, Fredericksburg, VA and an MFA in Sculpture from Penn State University, University Park, PA.

Patricia Miranda

As part of an ongoing collaborative project, Patricia Miranda creates monumental textile sculpture and installations built from community stories. These site-responsive works speak to the history of domestic and environmental labor through the complex feminine form of lace and the use of visceral natural dyes. The lace wall and sculptural installations are created from donated, found, and re-purposed textile.

Patricia Miranda received a BFA in Sculpture with a minor in Women's Studies from The State University of New York, Purchase College, Purchase, NY and an MFA from Vermont College of Fine Arts, Montpelier, VT.

Crimes of the Heart

BABE: "After I shot Zackery, I put the gun down on the piano bench, and then I went out into the kitchen and made up a pitcher of lemonade."

Crimes of the Heart won the 1981 Pulitzer Prize in Drama. Set in Mississippi in the 1970s, the story explores the plight of the three eccentric MaGrath sisters who are betrayed by their passions and must come face-to-face with the consequences. It's witty, irreverent, charming, and unapologetic. While light-hearted humor draws audiences in, the play takes unexpected turns, and suddenly, it invites us to examine troubling truths about life, love, and the endless complexity of human relationships. The arcs of the sisters' journeys reveal innumerable definitions of what it means to be a woman, reminding us that every person sees and

experiences the world in their own entirely unique way.




Winter Tales XXI

Journey's End

By R.C. Sherriff Directed by Dan Shaw

STANHOPE: "You don't deserve to be shot by accident - but I'll save you the disgrace of the other way - I give you half a minute to decide."

R.C. Sherriff's ground-breaking play remains one of the most powerful and successful pieces of modern drama and one of the most acclaimed examples of literature that deals with the horror and futility of conflict.

Originally set in the British trenches in 1917, Journey's End charts the tension and claustrophobia as a company awaits attack in their dugout. But by removing references to places and dates, it becomes a universal story of how warfare can change people beyond recognition.

"Sherriff's play, written in the 1920s and based on his own experience, comes straight from the heart. It tells it how Sherriff saw it, and because it comes with no agenda – either anti-war or patriotic – it is all the more powerful." – The Guardian
